JOB VACANCY: LENGTHSMAN

104 hours annualised, typically 2 hours per week - £12 per hour (negotiable)

Headon-cum-Upton, Grove and Stokeham Parish Council is looking for a Lengthsman.

The Parish Lengthsman is a person who can really make a difference to the community environment by maintaining roadside verges and drainage. The applicant will be expected to provide their own equipment, but a contribution will be made towards fuel and maintenance costs.

Duties include:

- i. litter picking and general tidying duties within the 30mph zones of the Villages of Headon-Cum-Upton, Grove & Stokeham, additionally anywhere else as and when instructed by your village point of contact.
- ii. Collecting dog fouling
- iii. Cleaning of village signs, noticeboard glass, village seats and bus shelters.
- iv. Clearing minor storm debris, keeping the roadsides tidy.
- v. Minor Maintenance and repairs of village signs, noticeboards and seats, for example tightening of brackets, screws, repainting seats etc.
- vi. Regular Safety Checks of parish street furniture such as bins, seats, noticeboards, Reporting any loss or damage to the parish street furniture to the Clerk.
- vii. Salt spreading on pavements as and, where requested, by your village point of contact.
- viii. When passing the salt bins, between Oct and Mar, check their levels and inform your village point of contact if they are low.
- ix. Any other ad-hoc work, will be discussed from time to time with you by your point of contact in each village.

Fighting Rural Crime

Neighbourhood Policing officers from Bassetlaw have recently secured additional funding to acquire state of the art equipment in their fight against rural crime. These include:

- Drones
- More marked vehicles with searchlights
- Night vision goggles & thermal imaging goggles
- Farm bio security kits
- Off-road motorbikes
- Automatic number plate recognition cameras
- Brand-new off-road vehicle stingers.

Split into Worksop North, Worksop South, and Harworth and Retford the rural policing teams are working together with partners and neighbouring forces to tackle the issues at the heart of the Bassetlaw communities.

The Police are encouraging anyone who lives or works in our rural communities to report incidents and speak to them – even if you just want some free safety advice. And if unfortunately you have been a victim of rural crime or know someone who has, they need you to come forward and report it.

Anyone with concerns about crime in their area can call Nottinghamshire Police on 101, or Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111. In an emergency or if an incident is ongoing always call 999.

People can also report crimes through Nottinghamshire Police's Live Chat feature, which is available 7am to 10pm seven days a week, via the force's website. You will be put directly in touch with a qualified, experienced control room operator who will assist you with your inquiry or report.

To access Live Chat visit www.nottinghamshire.police.uk and click on the blue round button at the bottom of your screen. You'll then be connected to a control room operator.
