

An update from Headon-cum-Upton, Grove & Stokeham Parish Council

The Parish Council has responded to the consultation from the the Local Government Boundary Commission for England regarding the boundary review which will impact upon our villages,

Work is being undertaken to ensure the defibrillators are easily located and accessible for anyone that might need to use them.

The locations are:

Outside Headon Village Hall, Church Street, Headon

On a house wall, on Main Street, Upton

The back porch at Stokeham Church, accessed through the church grounds

In a glass phone booth, on Main Street at Grove

Issues have been raised regarding the flooding at Grove, and the Parish Council is working to find solutions with the support of Nottinghamshire County Councillor John Ogle.

The poppies will be appearing on lamp posts shortly, in preparation for Remembrance Day.

The date of the next Parish Council meeting is Monday 4th November at Headon Village Hall, Church Street, Headon, DN22 0RE, commencing at 7pm. Parish Councillors welcome you to attend to ask questions and raise issues. We'd love to see you.
