Parish Council News

Notes from the Meeting held on Monday 4th April 2011

Severe Winter Weather

The Parish Council are in the process of purchasing a snow blade from Platts Harris Ltd in order that they can take over responsibility for snow clearing in the parish during severe weather. An order has been placed and the plough should be with us in the very near future.

Bus Shelter on Yew Tree Road

Our request for a bus shelter at Yew Tree Road, Headon, is presently being dealt with by Nottinghamshire County Council and we are informed that an installation is anticipated during 2011/2012. We have requested further detail on size and design of the shelter as it is important that the design be in keeping with the rural aspect of the village. If anyone has any thoughts on an ideal location for this shelter, please contact a parish council member with your suggestion.

Flooding Issues

A number of flooding issues are still being dealt with. Work on Thorpe Street has been recently completed to assist a flooding problem in that area of the village. A number of pot holes and problem areas have been highlighted in the parish and ongoing attention will be brought to the relevant departments until the areas are repaired and the problems resolved.

Community Emergency Plan

The emergency plan is complete and awaiting approval by the County Council.

Audit of Accounts

The Parish Council's year end accounts are now complete and ready for audit. Members approved the figures at the April meeting. Internal and external audits will take place over the course of the next 3 months and the accounts will be made available for public inspection during this period.

At the close of nominations for the Parish Council election on 4th April, Bassetlaw District Council had received nominations only from the all the retiring councillors for Headon-cum-Upton and Stokeham and so Alun McKiernon, Beatrice McGlen, David Landon, Janet Landon and John Mosley were re-elected to represent Headon-cum-Upton and Eric Briggs and Maurice Briggs to represent Stokeham. Unfortunately there were no nominations for Grove and the Parish Council will be able to co-opt to fill these 3 seats. Please contact the Clerk if you are interested in becoming a parish councillor.

Although there will not be a Parish Council election there will be a poll for the election of a District Councillor for the Rampton Ward and there will also be a referendum on proposed changes to the voting system. The polling station in the Village Hall will be open from 7 am to 10 pm on Thursday 5th May

Tales from the woods

We came to live in the woods, on a permanent basis, over twenty years ago. We had bought the cottages from a dear friend, who, despite her love for them, could rarely visit and had seen them burgled several times, so despaired for their future. Initially we had come only to enjoy weekends away from the increasing intensity of town life.

These breaks became a boon as we struggled down the lane, our car overloaded with supplies and dogs we entered our new enchanted world. There were two cottages and a schoolroom. Originally the teacher lived in one cottage and the estate woodsman in the other. The school had attracted children from the local villages who trekked across the fields to receive an education. Each room told its own history; the paraphernalia of its previous occupants stored in cupboards and furnishings. There were photo albums, books and mementos of at least seventy years of cosy living, each new discovery was a romance.

Only one cottage was habitable and this was pervaded by the smell of paraffin lamps and firelighters. Because there was no supply of electricity or mains water to the cottages, much ingenuity was required to make our new home feasible. To our constant amusement was the discovery outside of an earth closet with a double seat; this brought a new meaning to the phrase “marital harmony”. The temptation to try to live here permanently became overwhelming and armed with the naïve expectation that we could easily obtain a water and electricity supply, and having been burgled twice in our midweek absences, we succumbed to the temptation and took up full time residence.

To live here was to provide a unique insight into country living. Unlike the contrived television image of the semi-rural lifestyle it is amazing to realise the complexity of life without the mod cons we had previously taken for granted.

The darkness is so intense without neighbours and street lighting. The silence can be deafening without the noise of peoples’ lives. However, the dawn chorus in Spring, the owls hooting in the night and the birds rejoicing in the garden are an ever-heartening delight for a townie like me.

This place reflects the seasons with their accompanying joys and hardships, like few others. It affords its inhabitants unique solitude, amusement and ambitions.

We have tried, in restoring the cottages, not to change their basic structure but adhere as far as possible to their history. A history enlightened by many anecdotes from visitors, plus older local villagers.

We have not changed the premises much, but the premises have certainly changed us.

So perhaps in the next few months I will be allowed to regale you with a few tales from the woods.
