Notes from Meeting held Monday 7th December 2009

Vacancy for a Parish Councillor

There have as yet been no takers for this post. If you are interested in having a say about what happens to the village in the future (there are many changes in the pipeline eg around planning/building) then here is your chance.

Withdrawal of 6-weekly bulk collections

Concern has been expressed from villagers about the proposed withdrawal of this service. The council have discussed this, and have agreed to put forward their objections around this—more about this below.

Provision of bus shelter, Yew Tree Road, Headon

The Council will ask the County Council whether there is a possibility of having this provided.

NCC Budget cuts

The proposed cuts to be made in services were discussed. Many have implications on rural communities eg the reduction in funding for local bus services and the withdrawal of support for community transport and volunteer car schemes. Clerks resignation

Six-weekly Bulky Household Waste Collection

Bassetlaw District Council wants to scrap this service because, they say:

- it is being used by people from outside the district;
- it is being abused by people dumping building waste;
- it is unfair because it is only available to residents of part of the District Council's area;
- it reduces the Council's recycling rate by about 1%.

If you want to keep this service please write to Bassetlaw District Council (address on the front page) preferably before Christmas. Reasons to keep the service going include:

- Scrapping it will increase fly-tipping. Even if most of us are not so irresponsible, those who are already abusing the service certainly are, and if it were scrapped all the building waste would end up in hedge bottoms. At least now they are leaving their rubbish where it is easier to move.
- Bassetlaw Council is hung up on the fact that the service is unfairly not available to town dwellers. Apart from the fact that there are plenty of other services provided for people in towns (and not villages) e.g. community centres, children's play areas etc - why try to end the unfairness by scrapping the service rather than extending it?
- Many elderly and infirm residents, and those without transport, are unable to take their bulky and garden waste to a household waste site.
- It is more environmentally friendly for a lorry to visit several villages on a Saturday morning than for individuals to drive to the tip.
- Especially in the larger villages, people tour the streets on the evening before the collection seeing what they can scavenge. If the scheme were scrapped all of this rubbish would end up in landfill.

Theatre Club

In 2010 we enter our 8th year as a thriving and very active Theatre Club. At the last count we had almost 150 members, and hope that as our activities are advertised over the next few weeks more people will become members as they discover the benefits we have to offer.

We plan to visit Toilethorpe Hall again this summer, with the possibility of the lovely pre-performance meal to be included. Last year's trip to Scarborough was so successful that we hope to repeat that, too.

Our Social and Joining evening will be on February 5th at 8pm in the Village Hall. As those of you who have come in previous years will know, we have some nice food and wine, free for members and for those who sign on as members during the evening, £6 each for non-members.
