Defibrillators

We are looking into the purchasing these life saving devices, hopefully one for each of the villages of Headon, Upton, Grove & Stokeham, although this may have to be spread over more than one financial year. The overall cost will be between £4,000 to £6,000 and the Council has committed to cover half of the final cost. One defibrillator per village will mean all residents have access to a unit within a 4 minute travel time. The ongoing maintenance and inspection costs will be covered by the Parish Council.

We are actively seeking grants to help fund the remaining half of the costs. If there are any residents or local businesses who wish to help contribute towards these costs, please email the parish clerk or speak with one of the Councillors, any donation, no matter how small is greatly appreciated.

Bassetlaw's new draft Local Plan

Bassetlaw District Council is drawing up a new Local Plan to replace its existing Core Strategy. One of the main drivers of the plan is an increase in the housing need from the 350 new homes a year in the Core Strategy to 435 per year now.

Whilst there is no difference for Headon-cum-Upton (unsustainable villages so no development) there are major changes to most of the rest of the District with development permitted almost anywhere.

This is the first draft of the plan and Bassetlaw say they are 'open to ideas' for a different approach so now is the best time for people to comment. The draft plan can be found at www.bassetlaw.gov.uk/thebassetlawplan

Kathleen first came to Headon at the age of 16, so she has spent 81 years in our villages of Upton and Headon. Throughout that time she took an active part in village life for as long as she was able, and always maintained her interest in village events and people.

She saw a great deal of change during her long life. A few months ago, when information was being put together for a talk about Headon Camp she shared her memories of the Camp, the social events which were held there, the people she met and their stories and of what village life was like in the war years.

Kathleen was a good friend and neighbour and she will be sorely missed.
