Planning

Concerns were raised as to the length of time it takes planning enforcement to act upon breaches of planning consents. When we report a possible breach to the Bassetlaw DC Planning Department, an automated response is received informing us that the matter will be investigated and it could take a 'considerable time'. It can be months if not years after that for the matter to be investigated and resolved. Our District Councillor is to raise the concerns on our behalf.

Snowplough

Cllr. J.Mosley has inspected the snowplough, it is in full working order however, one of the small wheels is wobbly. It is thought that larger wheels would be more suitable and Cllr. J.Mosley agreed to look into the possibility of changing them. Thanks to the recent mild weather, the snow plough has not been used this year but it is ready should things change.

Headon Village Notice Board

The positioning of the village notice board was questioned and it was suggested that a more central location would be better, therefore it was agreed that the notice board which is presently at the Village Hall be moved to the bus shelter in Headon.

Neighbourhood Plan (NP)

We are still considering the possibility of producing a NP for the villages in the parish. Further information is currently being sought as to the work involved and the benefits of having a NP in place. Sturton have had their NP adopted by the district council and this could be helpful as guidance if we wish to go ahead, or in deciding whether a Plan would be beneficial to the parish.

Draft Budget 2016 / 2017

The figures are now finalised and the budget was approved by the council at Monday's meeting. The Clerk will submit our budget to the District Council with a request for a precept that once again will not impact on the tax payer any more than in previous years.

The next meeting is proposed for Monday 7th March 2016, commencing at 7.40pm at Headon Village Hall. The public forum session will take place from 7.30pm until 7.40pm
