Parish Council News

Notes from the Meeting held on Monday 17th January 2011

Vacancies for Parish Council Representatives for Grove

There are presently 2 vacancies for Parish Council members to represent Grove. If you can spare a little time and have interest in local issues, please contact the Parish Clerk or Cllr. Jonathan Wallwin as soon as possible. Your input is vital in order to obtain the correct balance.

Severe Winter Weather

The Parish Council members continue to investigate whether they could take over responsibility for snow clearing in the parish. Equipment in the form of a snow plough blade has been found for purchase and now the members propose to source funding for this. A full risk assessment is required prior to the undertaking of duties and volunteers need to be in place to act in the event of another bout of severe weather. It is hoped that the County Council will assist with ongoing running costs once the blade has been purchased. This issue will continue to be investigated with the hope that should the snow return next winter, the parish will be better prepared.

Community Emergency Plan

The emergency plan is still progressing steadily, with lists of vulnerable places, volunteers and available equipment being updated. A meeting took place after the parish council meeting to move the plan forward further.

Budget 2011/12

The final draft budget was offered to members for approval at the January meeting. The budget was prepared in line with proposals from the last meeting in which members agreed that the precept should be set so as not to increase the impact on the taxpayer. This was achieved with a precept set at £3588 (£3584 in 2010/11). The impact on a band D property for 2011/12 will remain as last year, at £23.94. The budget was approved by all members and will be submitted to Bassetlaw District Council in due course.
