

Parish Council News

Notes from the meetings held on 10th December and 14th January

Precept 2013/14

The Council has kept the precept for 2013/14 unchanged (£23.94 for an average size house).

Broadband Speed Improvements

Councillor Ben Wielgus reported that a meeting with Defra has given us a clear picture of the next stages and a further meeting with Defra and the County Council will be arranged to discuss the next steps. BT has given a lot of advice and has offered use of their infrastructure; ducting, poles, etc. 20% of the surveys circulated have been returned: 80% of respondents want broadband (and a further 10% if the price is right). If you haven't yet returned your form please do so because a minimum level of support of 30% is required for the project to be given consideration. If anyone is interested in helping with the project eg canvassing, or can offer expertise, please don't hesitate to come forward. We need the support of the community if we are to succeed.

Planning applications

The Council objected to a retrospective application to retain a switch cabinet for the wind turbine on land off Ladywell Lane, Headon. The Council had no objections to applications for the retention and completion of a retaining and security wall at North Notts Trucks, Headon Camp and the construction of a general purpose agricultural storage unit at Grange Farm, Upton but commented that adequate screening is required on each. The Council had no objections to 3 applications in Grove: the erection of 4 dwellings on land at the former Garden Centre, to remove a branch from a sycamore tree at The Old Rectory and to erect a first floor extension at Six Oaks. Community Speedwatch

The Police have identified suitable sites for Speedwatch operations in Headon, Upton and Stokeham and it is hoped to find a site in Grove somewhere near the War Memorial. Volunteers will be trained how to use the speed gun (which is shared amongst all the villages who have signed up to the scheme) and record findings in the next few weeks. Whilst drivers cannot be prosecuted (they receive warning letters from the Police and repeat offenders receive a visit from a police officer), the Police often use the results of Speedwatch operations to decide whether to carry out their own speed checks.

Highways

Two malfunctioning streetlights in Grove, a number of blocked drains, potholes at various locations and trees overhanging the road at Dog Kennel Hill have been reported to the County Council. The Council has requested a highways inspection to assess the condition of the main road through Grove and a footpath which has become uneven due to tree roots. The parish council's snow plough is ready for use and will be sent out onto the roads when deemed necessary.

Notice Boards

The notice boards in Headon and Upton have been refurbished and are in full use.

Public Forum Session

This session allows members of the public a chance to speak on issues relevant to the parish and to comment in advance of the meeting on issues listed on the agenda. Some village residents have expressed their frustration at not being allowed to join in with discussions once the council meeting has started (the law prevents members of the public speaking at a Parish Council meeting). The Council is looking into how to involve residents without causing disruption to meetings.

Communications

Once again it was considered how best to communicate the council's activities to residents. The abbreviated minutes of meetings are reported in the newsletter (as in this report) and it was decided that draft minutes could be placed on notice boards. But please note that these are DRAFT minutes and until they are signed off at the following month's meeting, they are not necessarily a true account of the meeting. Some councils do not publish minutes until they are approved, this may be something we have to consider for the future so as not to cause confusion.
