

### **Notes from Meeting held Monday 6<sup>th</sup> July 2009**

#### **Flooding issues**

Mr Ian Davies of BDC is to contact NCC to check on their responsibilities around work on Thorpe Street Headon. The Parish council are to contact him to ensure that the dykes are cleared, as this is still felt to be the underlying problem.

A member of the public, attending the meeting, brought to the attention of councillors the publication in the Retford Times of legislation regarding the consultation of the public and parish councils regarding flooding issues. The council thanked him for highlighting this and assured him that they are in regular communication with the council around these issues.

#### **Planning**

There have been several instances lately when the parish council have felt that the planning department have not acted consistently in their decisions. They have requested that Mr Armiger, Head of Planning, attend a meeting. He has agreed to attend on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2009 to answer questions from both the public and the council. Unfortunately he will not be able to discuss specific cases.

#### **Parish Grant Scheme**

The council has been granted a small sum of money to use for the benefit of the area. There are restrictions for its use, and councillors will be discussing this again at the next meeting.

## VEGGIES

The Village Enhancement Group met recently to discuss a variety of issues.

### 200 Club

The 200 club membership has gone down a little, with the result that if we are to maintain the present value of the Grand Draw prizes, then the monthly prizes will have to be reduced a little. Members decided to reduce the monthly prizes to £40, paying out £25, £10 and £5, instead of the £25, £15 and £5 paid out at present. There will then be £310 available for the March draw

### Bridge on Brigg Lane

The VEGGIES have been following Nottinghamshire County Council's long drawn out process of planning for the essential repairs to this bridge, hoping for a sympathetic replacement appropriate to the surroundings. It is a very old bridge, with a brick lined arch, and is an important part of our rural built heritage, giving evidence of historic field, road and transport patterns. It is at least 250 years old, and probably considerably older.

Clues to its age are found in:

- The name of the lane, i.e. Brigg Lane ("brigg" being an old dialect word for bridge);
- An estate map of 1768 which names the adjacent Open Field as "Bridge Field", and names the lane as the road from Upton to Rampton village;
- The small size of the bricks from which it is made, about 2 ½" deep.

Initially we had hoped that the brick lining could be repaired or replaced, but this is not possible and it will have to be replaced with concrete pipes, so we have asked that the outside edges of the pipes should be faced with brick. This may be possible.

The real problem lies with financing the whole project. Fortunately, this is the County Council's problem, we just hope that it doesn't adversely affect the end product.

The County Council's Environment Department has to apply for funding to do the work. Their representative says that they have been quoted £150,000(!), which makes funding difficult. Apparently, when a project is going to cost more than £5,000, they are not allowed to go out to tender, but must give the job to their own Highways Department. Part of the reason for the high cost is that the Highways Dept. say that the weight of the lorry and pipes for repairing the bridge will be so great that they will first have to improve the surface of the lane leading to the bridge.


