Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 4th April 2016

Council Members

New Clerk to the Council

Ed Knox has been appointed as our new Parish Clerk with effect from 1st June 2016 he and Karen are working in tandem until the end of the month.

Planning Applications Received -

Ref: 16/00707/LBD – Demolition of existing outbuilding and construction of self-contained annex for dependent relative – Glebe Farm, Church Street, Headon. The majority of members voted in favour of no objections, no comments.

Ref:16/00730/HSE - Demolition of Existing Outbuilding to Side of Property and Replace with New Side and Rear Extension - 5 Vernon Close, Grove. No Comments or Objections from Councillors.

Use of a Property as Car Dismantling Yard – Kalushi, Grove

The EA have provided an update to the situation *‘Environment Officers attended the site on Main Street, Grove. We collected evidence that suggests that cars are/ were being broken on the site which should not be carried out without an Environmental Permit. The site is being cleared and we did not see evidence of lasting environmental harm. We will follow up this activity with the land owners to ensure they know their responsibilities and legal duties for the waste they are removing from the site.’*

Neighbourhood Plan

The Councillors debated the pro’s and con’s of the neighbourhood plan scheme and have decided to run an initial consultation meeting of the Parish Residents on Thursday 14th July 2016 at Headon Village Hall. The purpose of this meeting will be to consider whether or not a Neighbourhood Plan is the way forward for this Parish.

Cllr Ben Wielgus has agreed to lead this consultation. Each home in the parish will shortly receive hand delivered invitation letter providing further details. Please attend the event if you can, this is your opportunity to provide an input.

Rural Special Constables

(Advertisement - Recruitment opens July 1st, 2016)

Could you do something truly 'Special' for your Rural Community?

Nottinghamshire Police are keen to recruit 16 Special Constables to work in a number of rural areas within Nottinghamshire. These Rural Special Constables will be dedicated to the needs of our Rural Communities.

As a Rural Special Constable, you will have an interest in the countryside and rural affairs. You will work with our local Safer Neighbourhood Teams, communicating with local farmers, land owners, businesses, churches, residents in the community and organisations like DEFRA, NFU and the Environment Agency. Like regular Specials, our Rural Special Constables will have full police powers, uniform and protective equipment and work alongside the regular force.

We are currently recruiting into the below areas. Please note that your base station will either be – WORKSOP, RETFORD, HARWORTH, NEWARK, OLLERTON or SOUTHWELL – depending upon your preferred location detailed within your application.

Worksop - Villages covered: Scofton, Rhodesia, Carlton-In-Lindrick; Nether Langwith; Cuckney; Wellbeck; Shire Oaks; Clumber; Hardwick; Holbeck; Carburton.

Retford - Villages covered: Gamston; East Markham; Tuxford; Dunham; Rampton; Leverton; Elkesley.

Harworth - Villages covered: Misterton; Gringly on the Hill; Mattersey; Clayworth; Sutton-Cum-Lound; Ranskill.

Newark - Villages covered: Collingham, Winthorpe, Farndon and Balderton.

Ollerton – Villages covered: Clipstone.

Southwell - Villages covered: Bilsthorpe, Lowdham and Caunton.

Specials deployed to these bases will focus on servicing their designated cluster of villages to which they are geographically aligned.

If you live and/or work in one of the above Rural areas, or if you just simply have an interest in the County's Heritage, the local Environment, Wildlife, Rural or equine issues we would like to hear from you.

As a Rural Special Constable you will be asked to volunteer a minimum of 16 hours per month (4 hours per week) working alongside other officers. **NOTE: By applying for this posting, you will be agreeing to a minimum of 2 years operational deployment in the role of RURAL Special Constable (post training) prior to being eligible to transfer to a mainstream special constable role.**

Recruitment closes July 31st 2016. Interviews will take place in August 2016.

Applicants satisfactorily completing the pre-employment checks will commence their training programme to become a Rural Special early January 2017.
