Field names

Maps of our parish covering the last 250 years will be on display showing the roads, lanes and fields, many with names.

If you are interested in village history and its development over the centuries, then you will be fascinated by these! Maybe you have wondered sometimes about the shape and size of fields, or why old houses are sited as they are—these maps may explain why!

Parish Council News

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 2nd July 2012

Planning Application 27/12/00005

For the past few weeks, a planning application has been anticipated but not received from the BDC planning department.

Proposal - 40m high wind turbine – land adjacent Headon Manor Farm, Ladywell Lane, Headon.

When the application is received, a meeting of the parish council will take place in order to give consideration to its content.

Meanwhile, those interested are urged to keep checking the Bassetlaw DC Planning Online pages - www.bassetlaw.gov.uk/planning to see whether the planning department have uploaded the application for viewing and comment. You are urged to submit your own comments if you feel strongly opposed to it. Simply enter the Planning Application reference number 27/12/00005 to search for the application and view the detailed plan.

Broadband Speed Issues

Cllr. Wielgus updated on broadband speed issues – himself, Cllr. B.McGlen and Mark Thornton are investigating how to improve speeds – installation costs, funding, how to implement. An ‘expression of interest for grant funding’ application to Defra is in progress, the scheme would require matched funding of up to £300 per household, but hopefully nearer £100 per household can be achieved. If the scheme was to be used, a charitable trust may need to be set up, villages would need to support the project and would need to commit for at least 12 months.

Highways Issues

Members reported that the following have not yet been attended to by the County Council:

Two drains and a culvert blocked outside Corner House Farm, Upton

Stokeham village name sign broken, Rampton Road, Stokeham

These will once again be brought to the attention of the Highways Department.

Public Forum Session

As from our September 3rd meeting, there will be a 10 minute Public Forum session commencing at 7.30pm to precede the Parish Council meeting. This session will give members of the public a chance to speak of issues relevant to the parish. We hope that the session will encourage residents to come along to bring issues to our attention, however we would appreciate if the ten minutes is not spent repeating issues that have already had an airing at other sessions, as the members will already have noted these.

Plastic Netting on Fat Balls

A local farmer has reported finding many plastic mesh bags, of the kind used for fat balls, in fields where livestock graze. These are potentially lethal to livestock as well as posing danger to the birds they are used to feed. Fat ball feeders are very cheap to buy and a much safer alternative to the nets. See the message below from the RSPB:

Mesh bags – a warning

Peanuts and fat balls are regularly sold in nylon mesh bags. Never put out any food in mesh bags. These may trap birds' feet and even cause broken or torn off feet and legs. Birds with a barbed tongue, eg woodpeckers, can become trapped by their beaks.

Please don't buy or use fat balls or peanuts in nets!
