Wild Willy Barrett, known as the Godfather of Grunge Folk is something of a musical prodigy, having learnt to play the ukelele at the age of four, Willy describes himself as "an experimental multi-instrumentalist." Best known for his partnership with John Oway, it is the gentler side of Wild that has emerged during his collaboration with this acoustic quartet.

From a cafe in Paris, via a hoolie in Dublin, to a night out in New Orleans with rip-roaring fiddle and banjo – this band does it all! A fabulous show suitable for all ages, directed by the inimitable Wild Willy Barrett. Charismatic French singer Aurora Colson takes centre stage, captivating audiences with her compelling and expressive vocals as she effortlessly tackles a wide range of styles: from Bluegrass to acoustic blues, with haunting Irish melodies and a touch of Piaf thrown into the mix. At the heart of the ensemble are the indisputable talents of multi-instrumentalist Wild Willy Barrett, cellist Mary Holland and Irish pipes and whistle player John Devine, whose outstanding musicianship was recently rewarded by an invitation to play in the presence of The Queen at Buckingham Palace. The group's innovative arrangements are beautifully performed on instruments including the guitar, cello, fiddle, banjo and uilleann pipes, all overlaid with a large dose of wry humour.

Parish Council News

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 4th April 2016

Council Members

Parish Council members are Jonathan Wallwin (chairman), David Landon (vice-chairman), Eric Briggs, Chris Holliland, Janet Landon, Beatrice McGlen, Alun McKiernon, John Mosley, Ben Wielgus and Fred Withers. Our District Councillor is Teresa Critchley and our County Councillor is John Ogle.

Vacancy - Clerk to the Council

Applications have been received for the job vacancy and interviews will take place within the next 2 weeks. All being well, a new clerk will be appointed in June.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN (NP) presentation – James Green, Bassetlaw DC

Over 20 communities are now producing NPs. Development Plans are put in place by BDC and development land is allocated. BDC are presently starting a new Local Plan. NPs allow control over development in the local area. Local communities have a say in new development designs and scale. When a NP is adopted by BDC it replaces the Core Strategy and holds weight when determining planning applications.

The NP process can take 18 months to complete, the stages are:

- Public meeting to raise awareness of producing a NP
- Designation of geographical neighbourhood area to be covered by the plan
- Contact BDC to let them know we intend to produce a NP
- BDC to agree the designated area
- Consultation with local people, residents and businesses
- Thinking 15 years into the future with regards development and planning of the parish
- Employ a planning consultant to produce the draft NP
- Funding available through 'Locality' up to £9,000 and 'Awards for All' up to £10,000
- Parish Council hold the funds and keep an account of spending
- Set up a steering group of volunteers (parish councillors and local residents)
- Consult on draft NP, circulate to various people
- Make amendments then submit the final draft NP to BDC who consult again
- Examiner is appointed to undertake examination of the NP
- Referendum takes place in the parish – at least 50% in favour is required before BDC can adopt the NP
- BDC adopt the NP

If members decide to pursue the production of a NP, a public meeting will be announced and everyone will be welcome to attend.

Planning Application Received - Ref: 16/00353/FUL

Ref: 16/00399/HSE – Alteration of existing access to a highway and creation of a hardstanding – Longacres, Main Street, Upton, DN22 0RA - The application has been objected to by the parish council with supporting comments submitted.

Ref: 16/00528/HSE - Erect Two Storey Rear Extension and Single Storey Side Porch Extension - The Holdings, Greenspotts Lane, Headon, DN22 0RQ – The application was received on the day of the meeting and will be given consideration prior to the comments deadline date.

Grants to 3 Parish Churches and Headon Village Hall

Grants of £300 to each of the 3 parochial church councils, Headon, Stokeham and Grove, were approved by members.

A grant of £300 to Headon-cum-Upton Village Hall was approved by members.

A letter accompanying each cheque will request feedback as to how the grant is spent.

Precept and Concurrent Grants

Bassetlaw DC has confirmed that we will receive our precept of £3,654 and concurrent grant of £97 (total £3,751) in 2 instalments.

Request for Speed Limit Reduction – Nether Headon

A response from Matt Duckworth - Senior Highways Liaison Officer at NCC, informs us that due to the speed restriction criteria and that there have been no significant accidents, we are not considered high priority.

Use of a Property as Car Dismantling Yard – Kalushi, Grove

Concerns were reported that a property in Grove is being used as a business. There is strong evidence to suggest this and 15 or so cars are at the property, part of the building has even been demolished. There has been no application for a change of use to the property. This will be investigated.

Grove Level Crossing

DCllr. T.Critchley reported that she is putting together a case to lobby Network Rail with regards to closing the level crossing at Grove. All affected parties are to be contacted to contribute towards a package in support of the closure. DCllr. T.Critchley will keep us informed of progress.

Public Forum Session

The 10 minute Public Forum session is at 7.30pm prior to the parish council meeting giving residents the chance to speak to members. Whilst you are welcome to watch the whole meeting, you are reminded that from 7.40pm when the parish council meeting has started, any discussion or interruptions from the public is not allowed.

The next meeting is proposed for Monday 1st June 2016, commencing at 7.40pm at Headon Village Hall. The public forum session will take place from 7.30pm until 7.40pm.
