Parish Council News

Notes from the Annual Meeting held on Monday 10th May 2010

Chairman and Vice Chairman

Cllr. Janet Landon was re-elected as Chairman.

Cllr. Jonathan Wallwin was re-elected as Vice-Chairman.

Flooding

The various areas of flooding in the Parish will continue to be monitored and re-addressed.

Pot Holes

A number of pot holes in the area have been reported for remedial works. Although some works have been carried out by Nottinghamshire County Council, the potholes will continue to be monitored for deterioration and re-addressed should they become a health and safety issue. Two dips in the road at Thorpe Street, Headon (believed to be the result of sinking following reinstatement of the road surface after cable laying) are to be investigated by Notts County Council Highways Dept.

Community Emergency Plan

The Parish Council preparation of a centrally held Community Emergency Plan is underway. Upon completion, the plan will play a vital role in the event of a disaster or emergency in the area. Residents may be asked to provide information to assist completion of the plan.

Church and Village Hall Grants

Grants have been made to the Parochial Church Councils at Grove, Stokeham and Headon-cum-Upton. Also a grant has been made to Headon-cum-Upton Village Hall.

Drop-in Sessions

Bassetlaw DC are presently consulting with Parish Councils and the public on preparation of a document on "Core Issues and Options". The document will set out the proposed settlement hierarchy and likely development prospects for our area up to 2026. Members of the public are invited to attend the Market Hall, Retford Town Hall between the hours of 2pm and 7pm on 8th June 2010.
