Parish Council News
Notes from the Meeting held on Monday 9th May 2011

Parish Council Election 2011

The Parish Council report in the last issue of *Heads-Up* listed the councillors who had been elected for Headon-cum-Upton and Stokeham and said that there been no nominations for Grove. However, Jonathan Wallwin did submit a form but it was not received until after the closing date for nominations. The Council duly co-opted him and immediately elected him as Chairman for the coming year. Beatrice Mc Glen was elected as Vice-Chairman.

As there are still two vacancies at Grove, we ask you to please contact the clerk or Cllr. Jonathan Wallwin if you are interested in becoming a parish council member. Your main commitment is to attend 10 evening meetings per year and to be a contact for residents between meetings. The level of involvement outside of this commitment is purely dependent on your own interests.

Bus Shelter

Our request for a bus shelter at Yew Tree Road, Headon is being dealt with by Notts County Council and we are informed that an installation is anticipated during 2011/12. It has been suggested that the shelter be installed on the land between the phone box and the litter bin, set back from the pavement. A design for the bus shelter has been requested as it is felt it needs to be in keeping with its surroundings as well as being functional.

Pot Holes

A number of pot holes and problem highway areas have now been marked out for repair. Remedial works are anticipated to take place in the next few weeks.

Severe Winter Weather

The Parish Council anticipate delivery of the snow plough blade from Platts Harris Ltd within the next few weeks. The plough will be kept in storage within the parish for future use in severe weather conditions.

Community Emergency Plan

The emergency plan is now complete.

Grants

The council has once again approved a number of grants to assist with village hall running costs and churchyard maintenance within the parish.

Neighbourhood Watch Scheme

Subscription to the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme has once again been renewed giving us a further year of inclusion in the scheme.

Audit of Accounts

The Parish Council's year end accounts are complete and ready for audit. Internal and external audits will take place over the course of the next 3 months and the accounts will be made available for public inspection during this period.
