All four musicians have their roots in bluegrass music but their collective influences reach much further and this shows in their music. Grove Road Level Crossing

Police

Garden Refuse Collection

Bassetlaw District Council has agreed to expand their Refuse Service to include a fortnightly kerbside garden waste collection service from March 2017 to November 2017. This will be an opt-in chargeable service at £30pa. A discussion about the possible implications of this to residents followed. It was pointed out that in other districts such a scheme has led to the forbidding of all organic waste in the general rubbish and concern was expressed that this may well happen here.
