Wrigley's career as a singer and storyteller began in the late 1960s, when a love of folk music led him to perform in folk clubs. Since then he has released over sixteen albums of traditional and original songs, stories and monologues. His main instruments are the guitar and concertina.

He began acting around the same time and has made many appearances on stage, most famously in Samuel Beckett's *Waiting for Godot* alongside Mike Harding at Bolton's Octagon Theatre, and Jim Cartwright's *Road* at the Royal Exchange Theatre, Manchester.



Wrigley has made many appearances in British TV programmes, including *Phoenix Nights* (where he was Dodgy Eric, who sold club owner Brian Potter a *Das Boot* fruit machine, a bucking bronco and an obscene bouncy castle), *Emmerdale* (as eccentric rocket inventor Barry Clegg) and *Coronation Street* (most recently as the Rev. Marvin Winstanley, the shady 'internet priest' whom Roy and Hayley approached to arrange their wedding - Wrigley's sixth character in the soap). His other credits include *Last of the Summer Wine*, *Cold Feet*, *Coogan's Run*, *Dinnerladies*, *Victoria Wood With All The Trimmings* and *In with the Flynnns*. He also appeared as a union official in *Brassed Off* and as a school teacher in *Rita, Sue and Bob Too*. In 1978 he was a night school teacher in Alan Bennett's play *Me—I'm Afraid of Virginia Woolf*.

Parish Council News

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 4th July 2016

Council Members

Parish Council members are Jonathan Wallwin (chairman), David Landon (vice-chairman), Eric Briggs, Chris Holiland, Janet Landon, Beatrice McGlen, Alun McKiernon, John Mosley, Ben Wielgus and Fred Withers. Our District Councillor is Teresa Critchley and our County Councillor is John Ogle.

No Planning Applications Received

Grove Road Level Crossing

District Councillor Teresa Critchley is keen to hear from all residents regarding their experiences of delays caused by the crossing, particularly if you have been affected by delays in emergency services reaching you. Please feel free to email Teresa your experiences (teresa.critchley@bassetlaw.gov.uk) she is gathering evidence to help support the replacement of the crossing with a bridge.

Grass Verge Cutting Frequencies

Notts County Council has advised the grass verges in the parish are cut twice a year in rural areas and five times in urban areas. Verges which are deemed conservation verges, due to the special flora and fauna they contain are only cut once a year, usually in September. Cllr. McGlen reported the Notified Road Verge along Westfields approaching Upton and part of the SSI around Gamston Woods has been cut too early. The Clerk has written to complain to the Highways Manager about this.

Neighbourhood Plan

Cllr. Wielgus & District Cllr Critchley are to hold a meeting at Headon Village Hall, to gauge the interest of the people of Headon, Upton, Grove & Stokeham. Following the outcome of this meeting a decision will be made by the Council as to whether we shall proceed with a plan.

Sheffield City Council Region

District Cllr Critchley attended an extra ordinary cabinet meeting which was voting through the process of devolution to Sheffield City Council Region (SCR), the information included:

- The 6 week consultation period has begun, it ends 12th August 2016
- The Mayor will be able to levy an additional precept, without limit, on any home in its region
- Voting System of 2 votes for City Cllrs to 1 vote of District Cllrs.
- No option given as part of this consultation to 'Not' join Sheffield City Area.
- Dist Cllr Critchley & County Cllr Ogle have a petition of around 900 signature to ask for a Referendum vote regards SCR, they need 4100 to allow it to be looked at by a Govt Minister.
- Responsibility for Highway Maintenance along with Bus Services will go to SCR
- Alternative options could have been - stay as we are with no extra level of Govt, form an area called D2N2 (Derby/Notts Region) or a Unitary Authority.
- 1,700000 people will share a budget of £30million

Grove, Headon, Upton and Stokeham Neighbourhood Plan

More than 30 people attended a meeting in late August to discuss whether the villages should work together to produce a neighbourhood plan that will help shape how our villagers develop over the next 15 years. The meeting opened with a presentation from Ben Wielgus, parish councillor for Grove, which explained what a neighbourhood plan was and what it can and can't do. In summary:

What they are

- A chance to have a say on what is developed
- Can include detail on the design standards of buildings that take precedence over the Local Plan
- Can identify where development might happen including homes, offices, utilities, amenities

What they are not

- A way of stopping all development
- A way of building anything you want without going through normal planning and building control consultations

There was lots of discussion about the value of a plan, or not but ultimately, most people felt that it was better to have our say and try to shape the future of our villages than remain silent.

When put to a vote, 25 of the 30 people there thought that a plan should be developed and 10 people agreed to form a steering committee to decide on a way forward. This group will initially meet in September. In the meantime, if you have any thoughts, ideas or suggestions, please feel free to contact ben@wielgus.co.uk.
