For instance, did you know.....

- that our church was built 900 years ago?
- that the Sheriff of Nottingham was buried here in about 1300 and that his effigy is in the church?
- that the bell frame is the oldest in Nottinghamshire

Other things to see:

The priests' vestments belonging to our church will be on display. We don't have many, but they are beautiful! They are not worn nowadays, so this is a rare opportunity to see them.

Also on display will be maps of the parish from the 18th, 19th and 20th centuries, showing many of the lanes, fields and field names of those times. These tell us so much about the culture and agriculture of times gone by in our village.

For many years now, I have been researching the field names in our parish. They really are fascinating and tell us so much about what our villages were like in times gone by, and what went on here.

There are some field names which have survived from Viking and mediaeval times—imagine that—a succession of villagers have used that same name for that particular field for well over 1000 years!

If you are interested in the village and its past, and why it looks as it does, you, too, will be fascinated by these!

Parish Council News

Notes from the Meeting held on Monday 5th September 2011

New Parish Councillor for Grove

At Monday's meeting, we co-opted a new member onto the Parish Council to represent Grove village. Mr Ben Wielgus of Main Street, Grove, was welcomed by the other members and judging by his input at this first meeting, he will be an asset to the parish council as he has experience in the background of issues often raised around the parish council meeting table. His input at forthcoming meetings will be greatly valued.

One Parish Council Vacancy

As there is still one vacancy remaining at Grove, we ask you to please contact the clerk or Cllr. Jonathan Wallwin if you are interested in becoming a parish council member and making our team complete. Your main commitment is to attend 10 evening meetings per year and to be a contact for residents between meetings. The level of involvement outside of this commitment is purely dependent on your own interests.

Street Lighting in Nottinghamshire - consultation

A year ago, the County Council Cabinet approved proposals for a 4 year programme of changes to street lighting aimed at saving over 25% of energy use. The draft proposals for our villages can be seen on the website: www3.nottinghamshire.gov.uk/streetlightingchanges.

In essence, the proposals are to turn off lights between midnight and 5.30am. Whilst the parish council supports energy saving, we believe that a selective lighting scheme would be far better and have made a number of comments for their consideration, the main ones being concern at lighting being switched off at road junctions for road safety reasons, and certain key areas which may become a magnet for crime should the areas be in darkness.

Road Cleansing

It was noted that the roadside drains at Headon are full of sediment and in need of cleaning. A road sweep is due in October, so a request for jetting of the drains has been lodged.

Household Waste Recycling Centre Closure at Retford

Retford Household Waste Recycling Centre closed on 4th September for 12 weeks for refurbishment. You are asked to use the Worksop Recycling Centre for the time being.

Police

PC Bailey reported that there have been 2 crimes since his last report - the theft of metal bars from a tractor at Headon on 20th August and a burglary at Headon on 25th August.

The major current problem is the theft of cable with thieves cutting down power lines and pulling up telephone wires to sell the metal as scrap. The thefts have been taking place in the early hours and some of them would have taken several hours to carry out. Residents are asked to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity around power lines, in fields, telephone points, etc. The thieves may appear to be workmen and probably ignored for this reason, so please be aware and report anything you feel is suspicious.
