Parish Council News

Notes from the Parish Council meetings held on 23rd July and 3rd September

Planning applications

The Council objected to a plan to erect a 40m high wind turbine near Headon Clump because:

- A possible breach of planning application 27/11/00009 (from the same applicant), is not yet investigated and resolved. This new application should not be decided until a full investigation of the previous is carried out.
- A 24.6m turbine granted in the nearby area (from planning application 27/12/00002) is not yet erected. It is difficult to visualise the impact and make a decision until this turbine is in place.
- We would like to see an Environmental Impact Assessment carried out, showing a comparison of impact before and after erection of the combination of wind turbines recently approved and applications pending.
- We would prefer to see the turbine mounted on a shorter pole and believe that a 25m pole can be used for this particular turbine.

Permission has been granted for a wind turbine at Mill Hill Farm, Nether Headon.

Highways Issues

Pot holes at the bottom of Dog Kennel Hill have not yet been dealt with by the County Council and will be reported again. An overgrown hedge at Lodge Field has been brought to the attention of the landowner as it is considered a hazard to motorists.

Public Forum

The first 10 minutes of each meeting is a Public Forum which gives members of the public a chance to speak of issues relevant to the parish. We hope that the session will encourage residents to come along to bring issues to our attention, however we would appreciate if the ten minutes is not spent repeating issues that have already been aired. Members of the public must be aware that once the session has closed and the parish council meeting commences, they are no longer permitted to speak. We suggest that you consider the agenda items in advance of the meeting and that if you wish to make any comments, you do so prior to the meeting proper. If you have an item you wish to be given consideration on a future parish council agenda, please contact either myself or a council member giving us as much information as possible to enable proper consideration on the night of the meeting.

Fingerprinting

Last month, we questioned the lack of fingerprinting at a crime scene. A reply from Patrick Mercer MP and Acting Chief Constable Chris Eyre, informs us that although fingerprinting is an essential tool in policing, the forensic services have been restructured in line with budget cuts. Services such as fingerprinting are now targeted on those cases and crimes where there is the best chance of evidence recovery. Fingerprinting is carried out at all major and serious crime scenes, burglaries and some stolen motor vehicle cases.

The Old Chapel

Concerns were raised about the amount of rubble in the river following the collapse of the old chapel in June. The debris is a potential flood risk as the water flow is hindered. This was addressed at the meeting and it is anticipated that the area will be cleared in the very near future.

Headon Airstrip – Microlights

A letter from a concerned resident raised the issue of noise nuisance from microlights flying from Headon airstrip. This letter has now been forwarded to Bassetlaw District Council Planning Department investigate whether there is a breach of planning regulations.

Car Park – Church Street, Headon

Once again, we have contacted the Estates Department at Bassetlaw District Council about making improvements to the car parking area opposite Headon church. It is thought that increasing the hard surfaced area and marking out parking bays would increase the capacity of the car park and help with parking congestion on Church Street.
