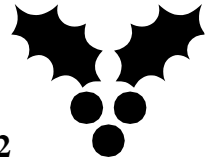

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## **A different Sunday morning!**

Something funny happened last Sunday morning. I was quietly reading the paper and listening to the Archers, as you do, when two rather strange-looking men came to my door. They were wearing bright yellow clothes, covered in black arrows, and were chained together. Reassuring myself with the thought that no genuine escapees would dress so conspicuously, I opened the door to them. The first thing they asked was "Where are we?" and even when I told them, they still hadn't a clue! They explained that they were "on the run from Wakefield Jail" on behalf of the Macmillan Cancer Relief charity. Fifty two people were taking part, and had been brought from Wakefield in a blacked out coach, and were dumped at Headon Clump. Imagine being abandoned there on a cold, foggy morning with no idea where they were! They had 7 hours to get back to Wakefield, with no money. So, I took them to Markham Moor, wished them luck, and left them to take their chances on the A1.

## **Headon hits the headlines again!**

What is it this time? Another visit by a member of the Royal family? Another win by Beatrice McGlen in the national Croquet Championship? No, apparently there is in our village one of the few, if not the only, example in the entire country of a species of apple tree that conservation experts were beginning to fear had been completely wiped out. This species is called the Sykehouse Russet and featured in a recent edition of Farmer's Weekly.

## **Parish Council News**

### **Notes from the meeting held on 2 December**

*(It should be stressed that these notes are based on my recollection of what was agreed at the meeting and not on the approved minutes)*

#### **Road Safety**

The local Police have now acquired a radar speed gun and are intending to carry out roadside checks of vehicle speeds. The Policeman was advised that the worst spot is on Thorpe Street/Yew Tree Road between 7 and 8 in a morning and again between about 3.30 and 4.30 in the afternoon. The County Council was also supposed to be doing a survey of vehicle speeds over a longer period and the Clerk will chase them up to find out what has happened to this.

#### **Grass cutting contract**

The Council decided to invite tenders for grass cutting for the 2003 season. Potential contractors will be provided with a map showing precisely which areas are to be cut to avoid some of the problems of last summer when some parts of the village, particularly Yew Tree Road between Halfway House and the T-junction in Upton, were not cut. The Council accepts that the cost of this contract is likely to increase substantially.

#### **Car park**

The Council is still awaiting a draft lease from Bassetlaw District Council.

#### **Freedom of Information Act**

In common with all Parish Councils, the Council is required to register a scheme under the above Act to be effective from February 2003. The intention is to make Parish Councils more open in their dealings with the people they represent, although, as with other similar initiatives, it is possible that the scheme will be bureaucracy-driven.

The Council decided to adopt the Model Scheme. Once this has been accepted there are certain requirements on Parish Councils regarding publication of information, which will be covered in a future edition of the newsletter.

#### **Highways**

Two problems will be reported to the Highways Department:

- Blocked drains on Thorpe Street causing the road to become a river a times of heavy rain
- The crumbling carriageway near the entrance to Manor Farm

#### **Planning**

The planning application to extend the Sewage Treatment Works on Yew Tree Road has been approved with conditions about tree planting to screen the plant from the road. The Village Enhancement Group has taken on responsibility for trying to ensure that this screening is done in the most effective way.

#### **Rampton Hospital Community Forum**

Allan Dolby attended this meeting on 29 November. The two main points were that the Hospital management is keen to work with local villages to try to minimise problems arising from their staff driving to and from work and are thinking of trying to introduce a Park & Ride scheme. Also the intention is to produce a rolling programme of tree planting etc. to try to screen buildings, particularly the new buildings, from Stokeham Road.

#### **Rampton Parish Council – defibrillator**

Rampton Parish Council has been approached by village residents with a suggestion that the village acquires a defibrillator, a piece of equipment which, in the right hands, can be used to re-start the heart.

The intention would be to try to get a group of volunteers who would work in pairs on a rota to be able to respond to emergencies.

Obviously the more volunteers there are the less demands on any individual and/or the better the service that can be provided. Rampton Parish Council decided that it would hold a public meeting at 7.30 pm on Monday 6 January with representatives of the Ambulance Service and the St John's Ambulance Brigade and invite representatives of neighbouring villages to see if there is any interest in widening the scheme beyond Rampton and Woodbeck. If you would be interested in finding out more, why not come along?

#### **Date of next meeting**
