Notes from meeting held on 4th November

Blocked Drains

Thanks to the support of our County Councillor, Notts County Council has re-visited the villages to inspect the drains and have cleared the ones that were blocked. If you notice a blocked drain this winter, please either report it to a parish council member or use the online reporting system (see below).

Hazardous Parking on Church Street, Headon

A few owners have been parking their vehicles on the pavement and on the bend at Church Street, Headon. As a result, pedestrians are being forced onto the road to pass by, which is obviously potentially dangerous especially for the elderly and those with small children. Please park sensibly in this area, we realise that parking space is at a premium and we are presently looking into ways of making improvements. Pavement parking creates hazards so please think twice before mounting the kerb.

Grove War Memorial

We are still seeking residents who would be willing to give a few hours to help tidy up the War Memorial. Ideally, rebuilding the steps and re-slabbing the top would be the best outcome, but a general tidy up would be a huge improvement. Police Report

PC Bailey normally either drops in briefly at the Parish Council meeting or e-mails a crime report to the Clerk if he can't be there. He has not attended a meeting nor sent a crime report since July and it has recently been reported that Beat Managers have been redeployed to deal with increased crime in Manton and Harworth. When the Chief Constable was challenged about this at a Rural Policing Seminar earlier this week he said that they had to prioritise and if that meant taking Beat Managers away then that's what they'd do, but it would be for a maximum of 2 months and we would still be in the safe hands of the PCSOs. When those present, led by Cllr John Ogle, said that wasn't satisfactory, the Police & Crime Commissioner, Paddy Tipping, has agreed to meet with representatives of Parish Councils at a date and time to suit.
