ROB recycling has offered to empty these with no cost to the Parish Council so we are extremely grateful that we are able to provide this service for residents. Just a reminder though, these are for GLASS only. Any other items will contaminate the load, so thank you for your understanding.

The Parish Council continue to raise your concerns regarding local issues, to Highways (VIAEM) Nottinghamshire County Council and Bassetlaw District Council. Sadly, we don't always see immediate action but we do our best! HARVEST SERVICE IN ST PETER'S CHURCH

Yes, you read it right! After over 18 months with no services we are having a service in Headon Church, organised by the Headon Local Church Support Group and officiated by Gill Rann, the Licensed Lay Minister for the Rivers group of churches.

On **Sunday 5th October at 4.00pm** there will be a traditional harvest festival service at St Peter's church with refreshments afterwards. The church will be decorated for harvest and food gifts will be gratefully received on the day and later distributed to the hospice. Please do try and come to support your local church. Everyone is welcome including friends and families. Let's make this a service to remember!

St Peter's Church Support Group, 12 August

The Retford Times of 14th August 1885 published a lengthy report on the re-opening of the church two days earlier. It said that many people from surrounding villages and towns had come to the village to join in the celebrations which began with a well-attended Holy Communion service at 7.30am and ended with a free tea in a large barn at Manor Farm, attended by 300 people.

Our 140th anniversary celebration was more modest but we were nonetheless delighted to welcome more than 40 people. The centrepiece of the evening was an informative, entertaining and provocative talk on the church as "The heart of the Community" by Canon Rev Dick Lewis who seems to be as active in his retirement as he was as a full time vicar!

He explained that for much of its existence the church was used for many purposes, including markets and social gatherings as well as regular services of worship and special occasions such as baptisms, marriages and funerals. Rev. Lewis believes very strongly that the church needs to reach out to the people.

He was also very knowledgeable about the history of the church telling us that the internal walls would once have been covered with paintings and that once there was no seating in the body of the church and the congregation would generally stand or kneel during the service. Those who had difficulty standing would use the seating around the walls which is the origin of the expression 'the weakest go to the wall'. His knowledge of the 1885 restoration was such as to make the short talk I had prepared redundant!

Most of the audience lingered awhile, looking at the displays of village history and sampling the delicious home-made cakes and drinks that had been donated by members of the group and other well-wishers. Although the event was free, donations totalling £165 were received.

On behalf of everybody who cares about our church, thank you so much to all the members of the church support group, and all who helped, for their efforts in making the evening such a success. Congratulations to all of them for such an outstanding first event! There will be more and we hope very much that they will be as – or even more- successful! Janet Landon
