Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 6th March 2017

Council Members

Our District Councillor is Teresa Critchley and our County Councillor is John Ogle.

Councillor Vacancy

The council welcomed Sue Browne as a new member of Council. We now have a full quota of Councillors.

Highways

The following issues have been reported to Nottinghamshire County Council Highways by the Council: flashing street light no2 at Stokeham; blocked drains Main Street Grove; missing village sign at Grove; faded white lines at Upton road junctions.

Neighbourhood Plan

Cllr Ben Wielgus gave an update:

- A Questionnaire has been sent out and Online Survey completed
- 139 responses received, which is a very good return for the size of the parish.
- On 25th March 10am to 5pm, an Open Day is being held to present the findings of the survey.

Defibrillators

The defibrillators are being installed this month at Headon Village Hall, the centre of Upton facing the street, following the kind offer of Mr & Mrs Walton to allow a unit on their garage wall, and at Stokeham Church porch. We are waiting to hear when BT will remove the phone from the Grove phone-box, after which we shall install the last unit there. Cllr McGlen is in the process of arranging Retford Lions to run a free training session for the public in the village hall.

Village Lengthsman

A lengthsman is a community “odd-job-man (or woman)” and a subsidy scheme run by BDC makes employing one a possibility. The Council thought this was a good idea and discussed various tasks. The Clerk will investigate the scheme further.

Police

PC Bailey advised of two crimes in the parish this month, he also gave a summary of the crime figures for parish. PC Bailey asks that if you see any crime in action please dial 999 or 101 (if none urgent) to report it. PC Bailey is retiring later this year.

Planning

We are continuing investigations of the recycling facility being built at Headon Camp Ind Estate. The Council is arranging a site meeting with the operators/owners of the facility to discuss matters further. A letter sent to NCC regarding the planning process received an inadequate reply and will be pursued.

Interactive speed signs

These have been considered previously but at nearly £10,000 each the cost was prohibitive. Cllr Wielgus will investigate if more affordable ones are now available.

Public Forum Session

The 10 minute Public Forum session is at 7.30pm prior to the parish council meeting giving residents the chance to speak to members. Whilst you are welcome to watch the whole meeting, you are reminded that from 7.40pm when the parish council meeting has started, any discussion or interruptions from the public are not allowed.

The next meeting is proposed for Monday 3rd April 2017, commencing at 7.40pm at Headon Village Hall. The public forum session will take place from 7.30pm until 7.40pm.

Defibrillator Training

You may have noticed the strange yellow box that has appeared on the wall of the village hall and on the garage wall of Barley House in Upton. These are our new defibrillators awarded to the Parish by the British Heart Foundation. So what is a defibrillator? It is a portable device that can be used by anyone to help restart someone’s heart when it stops pumping blood around the body and they lose consciousness. For every minute that passes after such a cardiac arrest without defibrillation and CPR, chances of survival decrease by around ten per cent. It is therefore imperative we know how to perform both of these vital steps to help someone in an emergency.
