Parish Council News

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 5th March 2018

Council Members

Parish Council members are Jonathan Wallwin (chairman), David Landon (vice-chairman), Eric Briggs, Janet Landon, Beatrice McGlen, John Mosley, Ben Wielgus, Fred Withers, Julia Harvey and Janet Askew. Our District Councillor is Teresa Critchley and our County Councillor is John Ogle.

Public Forum Session

David Landon invited 12 members of the public to speak. A member of the public said they wished to object to the two planning applications in Grove because it is an unsustainable village in relation to the Bassetlaw Local Plan and it will be detrimental to the quiet character of the hamlet.

Grove Planning Applications

A planning application has been made for 4 new homes on land at Park House, Grove and one new home on the former Garden Centre Carpark. After a discussion the Council voted to object to both applications.

Complaint from a member of the public regards accessing carpark in Headon

After a full and frank discussion, it was agreed that a letter be sent to A1 Housing regarding the matter.

Waste to Energy Ltd Recycling Centre planning application F/3696 & Associated Environmental Health Matters - Recycling Centre, Headon Camp Ind Estate

The public awareness meeting was attended by a large number of people from our Parish and neighbouring villages. Planning Application F/3696 has been withdrawn, potentially with a view to re-submission. A local group of residents have formed an 'action group' to monitor activities at the camp.

With regards to ongoing pollution and noise, Amy Ogden, at Environmental Health is keen to hear from members of the public witnessing smoke emissions. Please email amy.ogden@bassetlaw.gov.uk to provide details of dates and times.

Speed Sign

Julia Harvey advised that Highways now has a list of sites around the parish for placing the temporary speed sign, starting with Headon at the end of March. Highways will also be erecting '30mph for a reason' signs.

25 x 30mph surplus wheelie bin stickers have been purchased from Laneham Parish Council which we hope to put on a few of our wheelie bins shortly. Janet Askew is looking into costs for possibly obtaining more. Ed Knox chased the Highways Manager regards obtaining permission to purchase and erect a parish owned speed sign, Highways are still looking into the matter.

Highways

John Ogle reported that the County Council Highways budget has been increased by £20M for highways, particularly for potholes and resurfacing. Potholes and resurfacing needs of Yew Tree Road between Upton and Headon, Westfields, Thorpe Street and the entire stretch of Main Street, Stokeham from the bend near Rampton Hospital Sewage Works through to the other end of the village, will continue to be reported.

Neighbourhood Plan

Beatrice McGlen called for formal approval of the draft Neighbourhood Plan for submission to Bassetlaw District Council. The Council unanimously voted to approve the draft and David Landon expressed gratitude to all the members of the Steering Group and members of the public who have contributed to the Plan. The Plan will now be sent for Independent Examination before a public referendum can be held. Village Lengthsman

Our Lengthsman continues his rounds, 4 hours per village, 1 village per week. The Council agreed that our Lengthsman visits his point of contact at each village to advise when starting and ending his shift, brings cleaning equipment and wheelbarrow with him so street sign cleaning may take place. He is to work mostly within the 30mph zones.

New External Audit Regime

PKF Littlejohn have taken over as External Auditor. Parish Council's with turnover of less than £25,000 will now declare themselves as Exempt from the full audit or must pay £200 a year. However, the usual Annual Return Forms will still be completed and published on-line.

Communicating and Engaging with Residents

Julia Harvey said the public meeting regards Headon Camp revealed lots of people said they had no prior knowledge of the plans and commented the Parish Council was poor at communicating with local residents. After a discussion on what should be printed in the village newsletter it was decided not to include verbatim minutes and continue with a summary. 
