Notes from the virtual Parish Council meeting held on Monday 1st March 2021.

The council unanimously voted to accept and welcome Cllr Craig Smith as the new Councillor for Grove. The Parish Council now has the full complement of ten Parish Councillors.

District Councillor Coulte informed the meeting about post Covid work to attract people back to using local shops and businesses. **DO YOU SUPPORT LOCAL BUSINESSES AND SHOPS?**

The Parish Council has written to Nottinghamshire CC in response to a recent email rejecting a lower speed limit request for Nether Headon.

The Parish Council has been approached to purchase four clear plastic boxes to hold freely available parish walking maps, the boxes to be attached to the parish noticeboards. Cllr Coulte informed the meeting about a fund that he has that could fund these items and go towards the printing costs of the new walking maps. The council unanimously agreed to support this item.

The Parish Council has been contacted by the War Memorial Trust to inform that the pre-application for a grant to refurbish Grove War Memorial has been approved and that the works for Grove War Memorial are designated medium priority and the works are necessary. Work has begun on the full grant application.

Cllr Whelan had been approached by a resident who talked about the setting up of litter picking groups. The Parish Council support this suggestion and will seek external providers or funders of litter picking equipment or the Parish Council will positively consider funding the purchase of the equipment. **ARE YOU BUDDING LITTERPICKER? Cllr Wielgus reported that between seventy and eighty people have joined the Facebook group. The newly formed Facebook group has received positive feedback. **HAVE YOU JOINED THE FACEBOOK GROUP YET?**

The Parish Council considered a retrospective application for the installation of up to 56 metal flues, external plant comprising of ducting, external plant comprising drying kilns and external plant comprising adapted shipping containers at Headon Camp. After an extensive debate, the Parish Council unanimously voted to object to this retrospective planning application. The Parish Council's full and detailed response can be viewed on Bassetlaw District Council planning portal.

The next Parish Council meeting is on Monday 12th April 2021 at 19:30hr. Please note that the current restrictions imposed as a result of the COVID-19 dictate that the next meeting will be a virtual meeting.



Book Review by Chris McGlen *People and Places of Bassetlaw, North Nottinghamshire* - Adrian Gray

Local historian Adrian Gray has just published his latest book on the history of our area. Bassetlaw is a name that has survived the centuries, an ancient Danish region that has ultimately become a constituency and a district council.

Having lived in Upton for over 30 years and having gone to school in Retford you may think I would know something of the history of the Bassetlaw area. Well after reading 'People & Places of Bassetlaw, North Nottinghamshire' I realise that very much more has gone on in what many people would class as an uninspiring ex-mining and farming community.

The book is laid out alphabetically by settlement and covers around 90 locations. Within these locations the book explores the characters and their deeds which helped shape the area we now live. Many interesting facts are brought to light, but to highlight a few; I was unaware that Beckingham once had a thriving shipyard employing 400, that Retford was a rotten borough (no comments please) electing two MPs with a minimal electorate and Tuxford was home to highwaymen and once had three railway stations.



Looking closer to home; three of the four villages within our parish have some history to tell. Stokeham as a religious parish which demanded its own minister and Methodist farmer John Otter organised mass missionary meetings in the 1820s. Grove was an important centre from Norman times. Back in the reformation Lord of the Manor, Sir John de Hercy helped create a centre of religious radicalism which led to the Mayflower Pilgrims. Village lands seem to have been sold over the years as a result of scandal and debt. Headon has one of the areas lost landscapes with its Tudor deer park. The village in the mid 1800s also had three clergymen. Finally, it appears that Upton has less of a history to tell with only a passing mention linked mainly to neighbouring Headon and hop farming.

If you want to know a bit more about the history of the area in which we live, then this book provides an enlightening source.
