Private Samuel Jackson: died from wounds 12th May 1916

Private Harry Hunt: killed in action 3rd Aug 1916

Stoker Ernest Ward RN: died 23rd November 1917

Corporal George Hunt: died from wounds 4th December 1918

Stokeham:

Private William Stevenson: died 29th April 1917

Private Alfred George Stevenson: killed in action 28th November 1917

Private Harold Richardson: died 25th September 1918
