Highlights from the Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 17th September 2018 at Headon Village Hall

Neighbourhood Plan

The Neighbourhood Plan for Headon, Upton, Grove and Stokeham was voted into effect this September.

Grove War Memorial

At the encouragement of the Parish Council, Bassetlaw District Council were able to obtain a grant to carry out a structural survey of the war memorial. Using the results, they're now approaching the War Memorials Trust to apply for a follow up grant to conduct essential repairs. The council is keen that these repairs retain the character of the memorial.

Village Lengthsman

The lengthsman continues to get positive feedback although is currently working on reduced hours following a lack of clean up activities in some of our villages. If you have ideas of things he can do, please do get in touch, particularly if you can help give those instructions to him once every 2 months in Upton. We expect he'll get busier again in Autumn. We are also looking for people who want extra compost material in Headon, Upton and Grove as we need somewhere to put the leaves he's sweeping up. Please do get in touch

Highways

Bassetlaw and Nottinghamshire Councils are being contacted about the overgrown hedges between Grove and Headon. A resident has also asked that we seek an amicable way to cut back trees that are making it difficult to walk down pavements in Headon.

Procedural issues

Work is still ongoing to hand over bank accounts and other access to the new clerk. Training is also being booked for the new chair and the new clerk.

Letters of appreciation were sent to all former councillors from this year to recognise their hugely valuable contribution to our community.

Parish votes Neighbourhood Plan into effect

Following over 18 months of hard work, the Neighbourhood Plan was submitted to a public vote on Thursday 6th September. Nearly 1/3 of residents turned out to vote, which is higher than almost any other similar referendum in Bassetlaw. There was a substantial majority in favour and the HUGS Neighbourhood Plan is now legally in place.

It is hoped the Plan will be very useful in guiding the Parish Council in submitting planning responses to Bassetlaw Council, who ultimately make the decisions on it. The Plan has strong weight in local planning law and helps ensure we have a say in Bassetlaw Council's planning decisions. It could also help us attract grants and extra funding to the area for things like investment in preserving our heritage and natural spaces.

Tour of Britain Returns to Upton

ALLAN GEORGE DOLBY 1934 - 2018

Allan Dolby was born in Laxton, where his family farmed in the medieval three field system. After school in Laxton Village and a small, private school on Cobwell Road in Retford, Allan decided farming was not for him and his first job was underground at Ollerton Colliery. He then joined the police in Sheffield before deciding to re-train as a male nurse. A 28 year career at Rampton Hospital culminated in a position as a nursing manager. He met Roma Brailsford at Rampton and they were married in 1972. Two years later they moved to Nether Headon, to the house next door to where Roma was born.

Allan was always a keen sportsman, playing cricket, football and weight-training. He became a soccer referee, officiating in the Newark league for 30 years. After he retired he resumed a passion for painting that he had as a child and produced many accomplished pictures of local scenes. He served on our Parish Council for many years, including a spell as Chairman and he was always involved in village life.

A diagnosis of Parkinson's Disease 14 years ago slowly changed Allan and Roma's lives as he became more and more incapacitated. He was finally released on 4th September 2018.
