Tour of Britain 2018

On Saturday 8th September 120 of the world's top cyclists, including Tour de France champion Geraint Thomas and Giro d'Italia winner Chris Froome, will pass through Upton as they compete in the 7th stage of the Tour of Britain cycle race. As it winds its way around Nottinghamshire the race, starting in West Bridford, will come through Tuxford, East Markham and Askham and enter Upton on Askham Lane before turning left and heading out on Westfields towards Eaton and then onto Retford and the eventually the finish line at Mansfield.

The estimated time for the race to pass through Upton is 1.21pm, although this is obviously subject to change depending on how the race develops and therefore it is possible the leaders could arrive just after 1pm. There will be a small number of road closures in the area through a 'rolling road closure' system. This is where the race route, and junctions with access roads onto the route, are closed while the race passes through. The length of closure of the rolling road block depends upon how dispersed the riders are. Typically, the lead motorcycle instigating the closure is 15 minutes ahead of the lead rider. The closure then remains in place until all riders and race cars have passed through. In addition, the organisers have requested that no cars are parked on the route on the day of the race

However if you are not about on the day then set your TV recorder as ITV4 is scheduling to cover every minute of the race, (hopefully they won't cut to a commercial break as happened last year). For further details of the event please see: www.tourofbritain.co.uk


