Notes from the Parish Council meeting held on Monday 2nd August 2021.

Grove War Memorial, the full grant submission has been sent to the War Memorial Trust on the 30th July 2021. The War Memorial Trust can take up to two months to decide the awarding of grants.

A generous £200 grant towards litter picking equipment has been received from District Councillor Coultate. The intention is to have available sets of litter picking equipment at Grove, Headon, Stokeham and Upton for local self-managed litter picking groups to borrow to litter pick within the parish.

The Queens Platinum Jubilee Beacons celebration on the 2nd June 2022, the Council felt the lead for this event should be via a local group within the parish. Grove has been suggested as a potential site for a bonfire not a beacon.

No further information has been received from Nottinghamshire CC about the request to review the speed limit through Nether Headon.

The Parish Council have received a request from a local resident to make representations to Nottinghamshire CC to review the speed limit on Drayton Road, Stokeham.

Grove signs, a site visit took place on the 23rd June 2021 to determine a best fit location for the signs. Entering the village from the North, the proposed sign location can be as per the existing sign. Entering the village from the South, three possible locations have been identified. Due to covid, a backlog of up to twelve months for the production of the signs currently exists.

Parish Noticeboards, the delivery of the four new noticeboards was on the 25th August 2021. Due to staffing issues at Via, we are currently waiting on the licenses to install the noticeboards in the highway.

Highway matters that have been passed to Nottinghamshire CC and Bassetlaw DC:-

Main Street Upton, private hedge encroaching over footpath.

Main Street Grove, private hedge encroaching over footpath.

Askham Lane junction Main Street Upton, road gullies blocked, previous requests already made about this issue.

Upton to Gamston Wood and Askham Lane, Upton to Askham, request for horse riding signs.

Brigg Lane, Upton request for litter bin.

The next meeting will be on Monday 6th September 2021 at 19:30hr at Headon Village Hall.

War Memorial Repairs move onto the next process

Thanks to some fantastic work by our parish council clerk Jim, we've now met the next stage of legal requirements and have permission to perform repair works on the war memorial in Grove. If you don't know much about it, it's well worth a visit (but be careful of the uneven steps!). It's an extremely rare example of a war memorial that's raised up and has two sets of entrance steps making it extra special. But sadly it hasn't really had anything done to it since it was built and it's time we made it safer for the next generation. The next step in our repair process is to apply for grants from the War Memorials Trust which has money set aside for this kind of work.

Village Gateway Signs now fully funded for Grove

We're delighted to announce that we have now raised enough money to fund the two gateway signs at the entrance to Grove thanks to a very generous donation from two residents in Grove. A huge thanks to Sid Pepper, Rachel French and their business Arramax. Along with the grant from Nottinghamshire and the Parish Council, we've now selected our provider (Morris Cast Signs) and are looking for ideas for the content of the sign to be included in the picture. What do you think represents our village? Grove Hall and the Church of course. But what about particular crops? Trades? Livestock? There is a very long queue to get signs made in the foundry so we should see the designs before Christmas but the actual signs won't be completed until the middle of 2022. Something to look forward to in the calendar of our village.

Headon & Upton Litter Pickers

Doing our bit for the community and the environment

Headon and Upton now have a strong team of litter pickers as the photo shows. The group of local volunteers met up at my house on 31st July and were issued with litter picking equipment which had been procured from MacDonalds. It is also hoped that the Parish Council can purchase extra equipment including hi-viz waistcoats, in order to help make the task safer.



Individuals and couples in the group have now decided to focus on their own specific sections of verge and so will be able to litter pick at a time to suit themselves. We are currently covering Upton towards Drayton, Upton towards Askham, Upton to Eaton corner, Upton to Headon and Brigg Lane, Thorpe Street and Headon and Nether Headon. The Ladywell/Camp area may well be added once we have more safety equipment.

It is hoped that we can now keep on top of the task and keep our verges as litter free as possible.
